Here are important information to help you prepare for your first quarter as a Highlander!

1. Before Arrival to the U.S.

Pay the SEVIS Fee

The SEVIS fee payment validates your SEVIS record and I-20/DS-2019 Form. You will need UCR's school code (LOS214F00177000) and your SEVIS number, located on the top of your document. Bring the printed payment confirmation to the visa interview. More info at <u>fmjfee.com/ig01fee/index.htm</u>

Submit the Statement of Legal Residence (SLR) to the Registrar's Office

2. Getting to UCR

Keep Your Documents with You

Store immigration documents in your carry-on luggage to present at the U.S. Port of Entry.

Schedule Your Visa Interview

Schedule your Visa appointment with your local consulate or embassy. All locations have individual reopening plans and different appointment availability. Student visas can be issued 365 days before your program start date.

Register for the Mandatory International Student Orientation

Check Your Program Start Date & Plan for Travel

Arrive no more than 30 days prior to the program start date. The earliest arrival date is on your I-20/DS-2019 (if applicable to you).

Complete Health Screenings and Immunizations

Arrange for Transportation
