This Month's Spotlight

Dr. Jia ChenAssociate Professor of Teaching, Department of Electrical & Computer Engineering



We asked some questions to Dr. Jia Chen who will be speaking at the International Scholars Meet & Greet on September 17th! Follow Dr. Chen's story below.

1. Please tell us a little bit about your background (before coming to UCR). I was an Assistant Professor in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley, specializing in data science, machine learning, and signal processing. I earned my Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering from the University of Texas at Arlington and completed my postdoctoral training at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities.

2. Please briefly describe your role at UCR.

I am currently an associate professor of teaching in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering. My major responsibilities in this position include teaching 6 courses per academic year, (co-)supervising both graduate and undergraduate students in research, and serving the department, college, university, and the research communities as well as (co-)organizing outreach activities.

3. How did you get into your field?

My Ph.D. and postdoctoral advisors, along with close collaborators (including faculty and students), made a significant impact on my research perspective. They guided me every step of the way. Entering the signal processing field as a Ph.D. student, I learned the essential components of completing a research project from my advisor. Empowered by a postdoctoral fellowship, my research interests expanded from signal processing into data science and machine learning. After becoming a faculty member, many great opportunities arose through multidisciplinary projects, thanks to collaborations with experts in other domains and the invaluable support from my wonderful students.

4. What are some of your favorite memories at UCR?

Some letters/words from my students are very heart warming, which are definitely precious memories in my life. Most of the time, I observed my mood being enlightened through teaching that I truly enjoy. Hearing students getting internships/full time job offers or being admitted to new programs always makes my day.

5. Do you have any advice for incoming international scholars?

Welcome to UCR! Embrace the process of each class and research project; the skills you build will prove invaluable to your future work.

Frequently Asked Questions

I need to leave the U.S. and ISS has not signed my DS-2019 document! Is that OK?

Please know that you do not need a travel signature on your DS-2019 document to either remain in or to depart the U.S. You do need a valid travel signature to return to the U.S. in J-1 status. A valid travel signature must be no more than twelve months old on the date that you return to the U.S.

If you are departing the U.S. soon and know that your travel signature will expire by the time you expect to return to the U.S., please contact our international scholar's office at internationalscholars@ucr.edu. If your DS-2019 is going to expire soon, please consult with your department to extend your stay and then contact our scholar advisor.

What will happen if I end my UCR appointment early and/or depart the United States and do not intend to return to the U.S. for my J program?

If you are a scholar and you depart the U.S. early (more than 15 days before your DS-2019 end date) and you do not intend to return to the U.S. for the remainder of your J program, please discuss this with your faculty sponsor. Please also email our advisors so that they can advise you on the steps and the visa implications of ending your program early.
