The United States is home to many of the world's most prestigious universities. In fact, colleges and universities in the U.S. host more international students than any other country – around 1.1 million by the latest count. The rich ethnic and cultural diversity of people across the U.S. adds to the unique experience of living here; it is that diversity that fuels creativity and innovation in every sector of the working world. But living in the U.S. and attending an American university is not like it looks in the movies.

A research university is a university that is committed to research as a central part of its mission. They can be public or private, and often have well-known brand names. Undergraduate courses at many research universities are often academic in focus, rather than vocational, and may not prepare students for specific careers. Many employers highly value degrees from research universities because they teach fundamental life skills such as critical thinking and real-world problem solving. Public research universities, like the University of California system, initiate the fundamental research that drives scientific and technological discovery. We educate, prepare, and train the skilled workforce of tomorrow, including future schoolteachers and professors.

Learning Outcomes:

This course is a series of 10 workshops with topics that help you learn more about the experience of living in the U.S. and studying at an American research university. Students will learn about the American university system, behaviors and expectations in the classroom, employment options and career development, leadership opportunities and collaboration on campus, the basics of American culture and adjusting to new cultural environments, and other useful information to help them be successful when they study in the U.S.
